Lesson Guide | Vocabulary

Personal Geography is an opportunity to show mastery of a topic by:

- 1. Recalling aspects of the topic.
- 2. Drawing the topic to the best of the student's ability.
- 3. Relating different aspects of the student's life to the topic.
- 4. Sharing their stories and drawings with a classmate or teacher.

<u>Expansionism</u> - governments and states expand their territory, power, wealth or influence through economic growth, soft power, or the military aggression of empirebuilding.

Manifest Destiny – The 19th century doctrine or belief that Providence preordained the United States to occupy as much land throughout the American continent as possible. A phrase coined in 1845, an idea that the United States is destined – by God, to expand its dominion and spread democracy and capitalism across the entire North American continent.

Lesson Guide | Activity Instructions

Instructions:

- 1. Prior to the lesson you need to review Expansionism in reference to Manifest Destiny.
- 2. Using the "Personal Geography Worksheet" provided, select four aspects of the painting representing Expansionism to share with your students.

Please note that you may want to have your students research and provide their own aspects they discover.

3. Review with display (write or draw) these four aspects on the righthand portion of the "Personal Geography Worksheet" under "Topic".

Instructions:

- 4. Ask the students what they believe to be important as it relates to the topic and have them draw each item.
 - Remind the students to have fun with this and that their artistic ability does not affect their grade.
- 5. Now you are going to relate the topic (Expansionism) to their lives.
 - For this lesson the instructor used different life stages such as: crib, house, back and front yard and car.
 - Allow your students the freedom to select and draw their self section. This gives them ownership of the topic.

Lesson Guide | Activity Instructions

Instructions:

- 6. As students are working, allow the students to show and tell their stories.
 - Some students will struggle to begin their self section story as it relates to the topic. Allow them to use your example but have them use their own details. (Where they lived, brothers/sisters, type of yard/neighborhood, car.) This still provides them ownership for their Personal Geography.
 - ALWAYS thank them for sharing, your students are opening up and allowing you to enter their lives.
